2. CLEANING AND CARING OF ARMS: Coys will utilise the next two mornings in the cleaning of all Coy weapons (incl all Enemy) so as to ensure that all weapons are in tip-top order and condition. Afternoon free for resting.

3. PERSONAL HYGIENE:

(a) All men will wash and shave daily.

(b) Oppurtunity should be made use of for washing clothes and bodies.

(c) Capt Pene (Act 2 i/c) will go into the water question with RQM so as to ensure that plenty of water is available to Coys for this purpose.

GUARDS AND SENTRIES: For the remainder of the present stay in this area the matter of gds and sentries are left to the discretion of Coy Comds. Natives of the country must be kept clear of the Coy areas Suspicious characters will be apprehended and brought to Bn HQ.

DRESS AND HEADGEAR: Coy Comdrs will ensure that personal comply with dress regulations as laid down for 2 NZ Div. Wearing of enemy dress, headgear and hats,: felt, balaclavas is strictly forbidden. Coys will ensure that this order is carried out.

6. <u>KIT INSPECTION</u>. Coys will carry out a thronough kit imspection and a return fwd to Bn HQ NOT later than 1200 hrs Wed 28 Apr 43. showing deficiencies.

MALARIA: Extract from NZ DIV RO No 30 dated 22 Apr 43.

2 NZ Div is now operating in a high malarious area and it is essential that all anti-malarial precautions be enforced forthwith.

(b) Coy Comdrs are reminded that they are responsible for Antimalarial work in their Coy lines. The following measures will be instituted forthwith:-

(i) Between the hrs of 1700 - 0700 hrs all ranks will wear long trousers, boots and puttees or anklets and long sleeve shirtsor jackets or blouse.

(ii) All ranks will be supplied with anti-mosquito cream and that it is used on all exposed portions of the body between the hrs of 1700 - 0700

(iii) All ranks will be provided woth a bush net, and that in these nets are used throughout the might. These items will be available shortly. If conditions of serviceallow beds will be laid out under nets by 1700 hrs.

7. MALARIA (Contd)

- (iv) All gds on duty during the hrs stated in (i) above will be provided with vails and gloves as soon as possible.
- (v) Unit anti malarial squads consisting of 1 NCO and three ORs per En or equivalent unit, will proceed with the adequate control of mosquito larvae with in Unit lines and in there immediate vicinity. This work will be supervised by the Unit MO or if NO RMO is available, instruction will be arranged with the nearest FD AMB.
- (vi) All occupied quarters, tents or bivouses will be closed and sprayed with Flysol each morning immdiately after reveille.
