NZ FORCES OLUB-CAIRO.
(a) Some months ago, to prevent overorowding, NZ Foroes Club was closed to troops other than New Zealanders. IKZ troops were each entitlea to invite a guest into the Giub. This restriction has resulted in B very much improved sexvice for NZ troops and it is intended to continue on these Iines.
(b) The position is now arising, however, that a large number of NZ troops are visiting the clubs of British and othor organisetions. This places an unfair burden on such voluntary organisations and it is felt that as NZ Forces Club is restiteted to NZ troops, other clubs should be left free to offer maximum faoilities to iroops other than Now Zealanders.
(c) The nocessity fon rationing oertain supplies such as becr, cigarettos, eto, results in NZ troops drawing more than thein share at the expense of thther troops, if they use the Clubs other than NZ Forces CIu".
(d) While it is not desired to Diace other Forces Clubs ofut of bounds, Coy Comdrs are requested tix explain the position to the troops and to request thom MOM to use Foxoes Clubs other than IIZ Gub unless invited to do so by troops of other forces.
