7. QF 2-pdr A/Tk EQUIPMENTS, Mks 1 - 111 A - REMOVAL of COVERS, LEG, FRONT; COVER, TRAVERSING GEAR; and COVERS, TRAVERSING GEAR SLIDES.

ME General Order No 516 is Repeated.

Instances have occurred where these Covers, which are intended as a protection against rain and mud, have been removed to avoid an accumulation of sand and dust when in sandy terrain. This latter will not normally occur under conditions now prevailing, and the Covers will give protection for which they are intended. All Covers will therefore be replaced and will not be removed with ~~out~~ prior authority being obtained from Corps HQ.

8. Grenades, 36M - Strikers and Detonators Sleeves.

ME General No 712 is Repeated.

Further to General Order 113 of 1943.

- (1) Units will on no account use paraffin for other inflammable liquid for removing grease from strikers and detonator sleeves of Grenades 36M as this practice is liable to lead to the premature functioning of the Grenade.

6. Messing.
