Sir,

In terms of the warrant under your hand dated the 27th day of January, 1919, constituting us an Advisory Board under the Expeditionary Forces Amendment Act 1918, we have the honour to inform you that we have now completed our investigation of the cases of all men whose names have been submitted by you to us, as those of offenders convicted by Court-Martial of offences indicating an intention permanently to avoid or refuse to fulfil their obligations to Military Service in the War.

We have held sittings in all the prison institutions where the offenders named in the list were confined, and have also met in Auckland, Christchurch and Dunedin, for the purpose of hearing the cases of those men who had ceased to be in confinement.

by he have carefully considered the case of each offender whose name is included in the list submitted, and have ascertained to the best of our ability, whether his offence was due to "bona fide religious objections to Military Service" within the meaning of Section 9 of the Act.

Generally speaking the Board was well received by the men in confinement, but at Roto Aira (Waimarino) and Waikeria, a section at each place - thirteen at Roto Aira and twenty-six at Waikeria - declined to come forward. Where documentary evidence was available from Defence and Prison files, all such cases were considered independently and a decision arrived at.

Every man had the fullest opportunity of being heard and the decisions of the Board in all cases were unanimous.

In compliance with your verbal request we have slightly exceeded the instructions contained in our Order of Reference by investigating and furnishing recommendations regarding cases where objections to Military Service were based on grounds other than those provided for in Section 9 of the Act.

The enlargement of our sphere of investigation in the manner referred to has made it necessary for us to classify the men whose names have been submitted to us, and we have, therefore, deemed it advisable to schedule our recommendations in the following order, viz.,

- 1. Those men whose objections to Military Service were based on bona fide religious grounds within the meaning of Section 9 of the New Zealand Expeditionary Forces Amendment Act 1918, and who are, therefore, entitled to exemption from inclusion in the Military Defaulters List.
- 2. Those men whose convictions were found to be of a character closely bordering upon "bona fide religious objection."
- 3. Those men whose cases the Board wished to bring before the Minister for the reasons shown.
- 4. Maori Objectors.
- 5. Men on whose behalf the Board is unable to make any recommendation.

In regard to all those men who are recommended for exemption on "bona fide religious grounds," or who have been recommended for special consideration, we were assured by the Gaolers and Officers in Charge, that their work and conduct while in prison had always been exemplary. The same could not be said of some of those who have not been recommended, although there were no complaints in regard to the larger proportion.

In regard to the Maori Objectors we found that none of the Maoris who appeared before us objected to Military Service on "bona fide religious grounds," but nevertheless we are of opinion that these cases merit your most earnest attention, with a view to deciding whether these men should, in equity, be longer detained in prison. We consider it extremely doubtful whether they are fully conscious of the nature of their offence, and whether they understand or appreciate the reason

for the further punishment they are to suffer by the deprivation of civil rights, if their names appear on the Military Defaulters List. The following quotation from a reply given by one of the Maoris we saw and question in Auckland appears fairly to represent the Maori Objectors point of view:-

"At the treaty of Waitangi we signed to make peace and "they put a Bible in our hands. They have now taken "the Bible away and put a sword into our hands and "wish to make us fight."

We found that the work and conduct of the Maori Objectors while in prison had been exemplary in practically all cases.

This man appears to be mentally deficient, The Prison Medical Officer's report is as follows:-

"This man has been showing symptoms of "insanity since his arrival at Waikeria "probably due to masturbation. He "has delusions that he is being persecuted "by Doctors and Police outside on account "of his habits. He is not dangerous, but "might become suicidal. His general health "is good. In the event of his discharge "I would suggest that he be examined by "two independent medical men with a view to "his committal to a mental Hospital if "necessary."

We desire to make a special recommendation concerning this man. From the information given by him it appears that his objection to Military Service was the result of a promise given by him to his dying wife. He promised her that he would not leave their baby. Owing to this promise Conway refused to take delivery of his kit at camp and was duly court-martialled for this offence and sentenced to imprisonment with hard labour for two years. This man's child is at present being cared for by a friend of his in Wanganui Conway's prison conduct is of the highest possible standard and we are of opinion that although his case did not come within our jurisdiction some special consideration should be given him.

This man was drawn in the nineteenth ballot and refused to parade for medical examination when called upon to do so. Gould is a married man with two children. The following statement was made by Gould when he was court-martialled.

"In the first place it seems strange that
"I should be brought into camp as I am in
"C class 2nd Division, for some reason or
"other they appear to have brought me here
"before I was supposed to be in Camp, and
"it seems as though there is some reason
"unexplainable for doing this, which I am
"at a loss to understand. However, my
"reasons are that I am a Socialist, be"lieving through reading and matter that
"I have gone through, that war should be a
"thing of the past in such a civilized
"and enlightened age, as we are supposed
"to be living, and if work which I have
"previously been doing was not considered
"as essential as going abroad to fight, then
"I have nothing further to say. I was
"working fourteen hours a day in the trans"port and shipping industry. I have been
"married between six and seven years. I have
"two children the youngest being 3½ years."

Due for release 2/10/19. McCallum holds the King and Queen's South African Medals. Although we were unable to obtain the papers concerning this man's Court-Martial it appears that he was ignorant of having been called up by ballot McCallum assured us that he had no intention of evading his duty, but having been assured by Colonel Purdy of his inability to undergo the training he naturally considered his obliga-tions had ended. McCallum's prison conduct is of the highest possible standard and we are of the opinion that some special consideration should be given him. This man's case did not come within our Read Reginald Charles jurisdiction. It appears that Read is on leave without pay until further orders, and that he is not an objector within the meaning of the New Zealand Expeditionary Forces Amendment Act of 1918. The following Minute dated 21/12/17 from the Assistant Adjutant General to the Director of Recruiting is attached to Read's Defence file No.D 67/3133, "The Adjutant General rules that R.C.Read, "is not to be compulsorarily retained on "Home Service, as this is not in the best "interests of the State, and Read has already "undergoise punishment for his offence. Please "transfer Read to Indefinite Leave without "pay in lieu of discharge, accordingly." In view of this man's statements and the Stott, Harold. contents of his file, we consider his case is one that requires investigation. Sentenced 27/5/18 to

Memorandum for The Hon. Minister of Defence.

In compliance with your request I have had prepared the accompanying schedule of the cases of all the military court-martialled prisoners whose names were submitted to the Religious Objectors Advisory Board, with short extracts from my personal notes regarding each man.

The schedules, as now arranged, have been compiled by Mr. R. O. Ancell, the Secretary to the Board, who has been employed upon this and other clearing-up work since the report was presented.

I might point out that the whole of the Defence papers regarding each court-martialled prisoner, have been obtained by Mr. Ancell, in many cases after considerable difficulty, and are still in his possession. In view of possible eventualities it is important that the files should be kept in safe custody and not distributed among the different branches of the Defence Department, some of which are in process of demobilisation. As Mr. Ancell knows the files thoroughly and has proved himself a reliable and useful officer, I think the question of leaving them in his custody is worthy of your serious consideration. We have, of course, an equal number of prison files regarding each case, with which the Defence files might be amalgamated.
